Weather Preparedness and Safety presented by the **National Weather Service and Cowley County Emergency Management**

Vanessa Pearce, Warning Coordination Meteorologist for the National Weather Service of Wichita **Doug Allison, Director of Emergency Services of Cowley County**

Alyse Yates, Emergency Management Coordinator of Cowley County

This presentation will include discussing what types of weather conditions we have or could experience for our area. Statistical information will be provided for what we have seen here in Kansas, including frequencies of different weather events and their potential magnitude.

You will learn the difference between weather watches and

warnings, as well as what actions you should take for each.

There will also be discussion about the actions you should or should not do during different specific weather occurrences.

Participants will learn about the National **Wireless Emergency** Alert system and what types of alerts are sent and when.

You will also hear

about what notification methods and actions are used here at Cowley to ensure the college community is aware and thunderstorms, safe during potentially significant weather events.

This presentation will discuss safety issues for severe weather and inform participants of what to be aware of, when and where to take shelter, whether you're at home, traveling or at Cowley.

Cowley shelter locations will be shared. **Everything from** lightning, straight line winds, hail, tornadoes, flooding, heat related illnesses and precautions, and winter driving conditions will be discussed.

Resources will also be provided to help eliminate risk through personal responsibility.
