### Introduction

Cowley College supports student success through coordinated work that is measured for success in the Accountability and Institutional Measures (AIM). Additionally, the College's current and past strategic plans prioritize student success indicators to support strategic challenges facing its degree and award-seeking students.

The data included in this set of dashboards includes:

- Retention Rates: First to second fall retention for the College's fall census, first time, degree-seeking students
- Completion Rates: Completion rates for certificates and Associate's degrees earned by first time college students at the 100% and 150% rates.
- Transfer Out: Average grade point average (GPA) transferred out by Cowley College students for their first fall semester at one of the public, Kansas universities.
- Employment after Completion: Employed in the region information, immediately following graduation, for Cowley College students who complete a career and technical education (CTE) award.

Peer information is also provided for each of the bulleted points above; this information focuses a comparison of the College with ten (10) of its Kansas community college peers.<sup>1</sup>

	Student Success at Cowley College
Introduction	This set of dashboards contains information about student success at Cowley College. The data used to create the charts and success rates are reported annually to the Integrated PostSecondary Data System (IPEDS) and the Kansas Board of Regents.
Retention Rates	The retention rates included in this set of dashboards reflects the first fall to second fall re-enrollment by the College's first time college student cohort. When an undergraduate enrolls in college for the first time <i>after</i> completing high school and/or a GED, that student is categorized as a first time college student.
Graduation Rates	Graduation rates are calculated at the 100% or "in time" rate and at the 150% or "1.5 times" rate for each award level. One example of a 150% rate completion is a student who completes a two-year award such as an Associat
Transfer Out	Information about the number of credit hours and GPA transferred by Cowley College students to the Regents universities is available at the Kansas Higher Education Statistics (KHEStats) <u>https://submission.kansasregents.org/ibi_apps/portal/BIP_Public2/KHEStats</u> The information at KHEStats includes information contributed by the Institutional Effectiveness Office at Cowley College for the Annual Year (AY) and the Fall Census collections.


The 2023 IPEDS Data Feedback Report comparison of Cowley College's retention rate for fall cohort year 2021-2022 with its Kansas community college peers shows that the College's full time student rate (61%) is 5% higher and the part time student rate (44%) is 12% higher than the average rate for its peers. 
The % of 2020 fall cohort members who completed and/or transferred out was 67%, up 5% from the previous collection year.

Additionally, the % of 2020 cohort members who stopped out has decreased 3% when compared to the previous cohort. The bar chart to right compares Cowley College's 150% rate(combined completion and transfer out) of 62% with its KS Peers.

Cowley College's undergraduates transferred to a Regent university for the 2021 fall term with an average grade point average (GPA) of 3.25; this GPA compares favorably with the average GPA transferred by the undergraduates who attended the College's ten peer community colleges from Kansas (3.32). The bar chart to the right shows the transfer out GPA for Cowley College and its peers.




KS Peer Comparison: First Fall 2021


64% of Cowley College's CTE program graduates were employed upon their entry year into the workplace following the 2021 completion year (2020-2021). This rate exceeds the average for the College's Kansas community college peers by 1%/. The bar chart to the right shows the employment rate in the region for Cowley College and its peers.




#### A Closer Look at First to Second Fall Retention for First Time, Degree and Award-Seeking College Students





#### A Closer Look at Cohort Completions within 100% of Normal Time to Completion by Award Length





#### Proportion of Completer Groups by Gender, Race and Ethnicity

The charts below tells you more about the students who completed at the 100% rate, specifically what percentage were men or what percentage were underserved student groups. For example, 26% of the 27 students who began in 2020 fall and completed a CertA, CertB or SAPP at the 100% rate were underrepresented students; this percentage increased 6% when compared to the 2019 fall student group.



CertC and Associate Degree Program Completers at the 100% Rate







#### A Closer Look at Cohort Completions within 150% of Normal Time to Completion by Award Length
