Golden Tigers Mission:

The Cowley College Golden Tigers is an educational program offered to community members who are at least 50 years of age. Through classes, day trips, and workshops, it seeks to provide opportunities that promote the social, intellectual, mental, spiritual, and physical health of its members.

GOLDEN TIGERS GUIDE

(Here are some important things to know about how the program works.)

Classes and trips are on a first-come, first-serve basis, and spots cannot be held. In person enrollment events are followed by open enrollment via phone and email. Details are listed on page 4.

ENROLLMENT

Fees for classes and trips are paid at the time of enrollment. There is a one-time \$5 semester registration fee, and each class's price is listed in this catalog with the course description. The listed price includes any additional costs or supplies needed.

FEES

CLASSES: Refunds are not given if you are unable to attend class. However, you may transfer to another class if space is available.

TRIPS: Refunds for trips are not guaranteed. They are given only for family emergency, illness, or death in the family. A substitute in your place is greatly appreciated if possible.

Transfer and refund credits are subject to an administrative fee and unreturnable supply costs. Credits will be held for 5 years and then considered a donation to the program.

REFUND POLICIES

In order to facilitate more fun for more Golden Tigers, individuals will be limited to signing up for only two day trips at enrollment.

If you are interested in more than two day trips, you may sign up on the auxiliary waitlist for the additional trips.

A letter and itinerary will be mailed to you with trip details the week before a trip.

DAY TRIPS

Classes require a minimum of 6 participants for a class to make. If you see one that you really want to take, be sure to invite a friend!

CLASSES

If you have earned credit via the refund policy or a canceled class, please be sure to use your credit this semester. A full list of credits is available at checkout.

Enrollment

Since enrollment is completed on a first-come first-serve basis, in person enrollment events are hosted first and then general enrollment is opened.

IN PERSON ENROLLMENT EVENTS:

In person enrollment events will take place at listed times and locations (see next page). To ensure an orderly process, we will be using a ticket system for our line. Tickets will be available starting at 12pm at Ark City's event and at 10am at Wellington's event. You do not need to arrive this early, but please do not congregate earlier than this. Event doors will open for phased entry approximately 15-30 minutes before each event.

GENERAL OPEN ENROLLMENT:

Open enrollment starts Monday, January 26th. Please call or email to enroll. Enrollments are processed in the order they are received. If you leave a voicemail or send an email, please be detailed, and expect a follow up with availability and to confirm your enrollment. Open enrollment is a large influx of communication all coordinated by one person so please be patient. While open enrollment will not close until April 1, please plan to contact Micah early to secure your spot in classes!

DAY TRIPS

Trip 1: Lunch and Learn at Cowley County's Cotton Gin Thursday, January 29th in Cowley County

Not everyone knows that Cowley County has an operational cotton gin, and even fewer know what exactly what takes place in a cotton gin. For this lunch and learn experience, we'll take a behind-the-scenes tour to see the powerful machinery and historic process that turns raw cotton into the fiber used worldwide. After our tour, we'll head to Pizza Ranch for their buffet lunch. Note: as the gin is scheduled to be operational at the time of our visit, all participants will need ride the College bus from the Brown Center so we don't overwhelm their parking lot; tour includes standing and single file walking (walkers should be fine though). The trip is \$16 and includes lunch. We'll depart from in front of the Brown Center at 9:30am and return at approximately 1:00pm. There will be no mailed letter or itinerary for this lunch and learn.



Trip 2: Botany and Bones Wednesday, April 3rd in Oklahoma City, OK

In the heart of OKC near Bricktown sits the Crystal Bridge Conservatory. This stunning 224-foot-long cylindrical glass conservatory is the centerpiece of the 15-acre Myriad Gardens. We'll step inside to experience a humid, tropical rainforest environment complete with a waterfall feature, exotic plants, and an elevated skywalk. Next, we'll visit the Museum of Osteology (often called the Skeleton Museum), one of the world's only museums dedicated exclusively to the study of bones, where we'll see more than 450 real animal skeletons including that of a whale and a giraffe. We'll leave at approximately 8am and return to Cowley College around 6:30pm. Lunch is included, and the cost of the trip is \$45.



DAY TRIPS

Trip 3: Swan Lake Ballet

Thursday, March 26th in Wichita, KS

Step into the world of *Swan Lake* - a story of love, magic, and triumph, set to Tchaikovsky's iconic score. Featuring a brilliant cast of dancers from around the world, *Swan Lake* by International Ballet Stars is presented by Classical Arts Entertainment at Century II. This production features hand-painted sets and over 200 custom-designed scenery elements to transform the stage into a dreamlike landscape. We'll plan to hit the town for dinner before the show to round out this exciting evening. The tentative time frame of this trip is 3:00pm to 11:00pm with a cost of \$55, which includes dinner.



Trip 4: Cowley County Stone Bridges Tour

Friday, April 17th or Saturday, April 18th in Cowley County

For our final day trip of the semester, we are excited to partner with the Burford Theater for a fascinating tour around Cowley County exploring the historical stone bridges. Former Cowley College instructor Gary Gackstatter returns to host this one-of-a-kind adventure, sharing his immense wealth of knowledge about the craftsmanship and history behind these beautiful structures. This is a fantastic chance to see some of the area's hidden architectural gems with an expert guide. With two trip opportunities, this tour is open to both Golden Tigers and the community. Enrollment for this trip will be hosted by the Burford, starting March 23rd via the Burford Box Office in person and online. More details will be available from the Burford closer to. Tentatively, this trip will be from 9am-2pm. The cost of the trip is \$60 and includes lunch.
